PALLIATIVE PHYSICIAN PRACTICE
HospiceCare's board certified hospice and palliative care physicians are available to help attending physicians address the goals and concerns of individuals with life-limiting illnesses. With specialized training in the medical, emotional, and spiritual dimensions of pain and symptom management (palliative care), these specialists are uniquely qualified to offer valuable assistance around end-of-life care concerns.

PALLIATIVE HOME HEALTH
People with advanced illnesses who are pursuing curative, life-prolonging treatments experience less pain and stress with the holistic comfort care HospiceCare offers. Our interdisciplinary teams visit individuals at home, working closely with primary physicians to monitor progress and minimize the need for hospitalization.

In a recent nationally benchmarked survey of families we've served, 99 percent of caregivers who responded said they would recommend HospiceCare to others.

HOSPICE
Those who are terminally ill receive exceptional medical, emotional, and spiritual care wherever they reside — at home, in nursing facilities, or the hospital. Our interdisciplinary care teams are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and work closely with people who are at the end of life, their families, and their primary physicians to provide expert, compassionate support that is tailored to individual needs and preferences.

SPECIALIZED END-OF-LIFE CARE PROGRAMS
HospiceCare is the only local hospice that offers specialized care for those with end-stage cardiac or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. With a special protocol for aggressive pain and symptom management, these programs help people with COPD and heart disease better manage their illness at home, thus minimizing episodes of fear and crisis and reducing hospital visits.

HOSPICECARE PLUS
Sometimes a terminally ill person would like to remain at home, yet his or her medical symptoms are too much for a caregiver to manage. That's when we offer HospiceCare Plus; intensive one-on-one professional nursing care that's available wherever a patient resides for optimum comfort and convenience.

HOSPICECARE CENTER
When complex medical needs make it difficult to remain at home, the HospiceCare Center is the next best thing. With intensive, around-the-clock care and amenities to make patients and their families as comfortable as possible, our short-term, inpatient care facility is the only one of its kind in our area.

VETERANS PROGRAM
Our HospiceCare's Heroes program honors those who have served in the military with care that is sensitive to their unique medical and emotional needs. In addition, veterans receive special recognition, connection to staff and volunteers who are also veterans, the chance to process their war experiences as desired, and grief support appropriate to the needs of military families.
